- **REMINDER!** Act 20 Early Literacy Screenings: Beginning the week of 9/16 through the end of September, we will be administering early literacy screenings for students in 4K-2nd grade. While the state is allowing us to delay initial screenings until winter, Bristol School has opted to do a trial run to ensure we are ready for full compliance later this year. After the screening, families will be notified of their child's progress in specific areas of early literacy. An early literacy night will be held later in the fall with more information for families.
